



SEMINAR

We propose the main lines that our society can develop in the post-pandemic era. They are a combination of politics, attachment theory, sociology, and public health planning. They draw out the implications of the Covid-19 pandemic. We do so mostly from the experience gained in our work planning and implementing health strategies. We see that an overall proposal, based on promoting secure attachment relationships and social cooperation, can contribute to the development of a new vision statement and strategies to help the recovery process.

We explore avenues that our society can open in the postpandemic era. We do so from the experience gained in our work in Autonomic and National Governments as well as with the projects we have developed with the European Commission and with Universities, the activities carried out in the Executive Committees of International Organizations such as the World Federation for Mental Health and participation, of some of us, in various United Nations assemblies. Attachment theory and concepts such as reflective function and reflective dialogue lie at the core of most of these activities.

From the trends that already existed before the crisis, from newly emerging strategies and from the practices developed during the crisis itself, it can be deduced that in the current situation of global crisis, we will learn at least some lessons. We also describe some actions for recovery, but which will remain in further social development. So we suggest some questions reflected in the program.


